

WHAT ARE THE ELIGIBILITY RULES FOR THE EXTERNSHIP COURSE?

All students must have completed 30 credits of the first-year curriculum before applying for the Externship course. Upper level students must possess an overall law school GPA of at least 2.50 or better in order to register. For first year students who wish to do an externship during the summer following their first year, the American J.D. students must possess a cumulative first semester GPA of 2.80 or higher in order to register. First year Dual J.D. students must be ranked in the top half of their class using their first semester exam results from their first year law courses in order to register (please consult the Externship Director on this point). First year evening students are ineligible for the Externship course until they have completed 30 credits of the first-year curriculum.

Please note: Externship credits for the Dual J.D. students do not count toward credits required for graduation.

For students who meet the above eligibility requirements: Students may *not* apply to a federal judge or state appellate judge without pre-approval of the Externship Director.
